	Arborvitae, Fire Chief	Thuja occidentalis 'Congabe' PP19,009	Full Sun	Height - 3-5' Spread - 3-4' A soft and lacy fine-textured plant, Fire Chief™ forms a perfect round ball. Sage-green foliage is topped with red tips, offering a distinctive look in foundation plantings, as low hedges, or in borders. Reaching just 3-4' over time, Fire Chief™ requires little to no pruning, making this the perfect, minimal care, landscape plant.
	Arborvitae, Hetz Midget Globe	Thuja occidentalis 'Hetz Midget'	Full to Part Sun	Height - 3-4' Spread - 3-4' Small evergreen shrub has dense, globe shaped growth habit. Rich green needles are arranged in flat layered sprays. The compact form makes this a popular accent plant for mixed borders or containers. Very adaptable, tough, durable plant. Evergreen shrub.
	Arborvitae, Holmstrup	Thuja occidentalis 'Holmstrup'	Full to Part Sun	Height - 6-12' Spread - 3-5' A compact plant with an upright habit. Bright green color and light bushy foliage gives the plant a textured appearance. Does well in light shade, tolerates poor drainage. A great hardy upright evergreen for the landscape.
	Arborvitae, Pyramid	Thuja occidentalis 'Pyramidalis'	Full Sun	Height - 12-25' Spread - 3-8' A fast growing, hardy, narrow, cone-shaped evergreen. Bright green, soft foliage. Shape easily maintained by minimal trimming.
	Arborvitae, Technito®	Thuja occidentalis 'BailJohn' PP15,850	Full Sun	Height - 6' Spread - 3' Technito® has the attractive dark green color of 'Techny' and retains it through winter just as well. This cultivar, being noticeably more dense, is an improvement because it will require less shearing. Forms a compact pyramidal outline. Discovered by Johnson's Nursery, Inc. of Wisconsin and co-introduced by Johnson's Nursery, Inc. and Bailey Nurseries, Inc., of St. Paul, Minnesota in 2006. (C®)
	Arborvitae, Techny	Thuja occidentalis 'Techny'	Full to Part Sun	Height - 12-15' Spread - 6-8' Fast growing and dark green. Excellent for screens and tall sheared hedges. Good in sun or light shade. Very winter hardy.
	Falsecypress, Golden Mops Threadleaf	Chamaecyparis pisifera 'Golden Mops'	Full Sun	Height - 10-15" Spread - 3-4' Yellow, scale-like foliage covers the thin, pendulous (mop-like) stems with a relatively low, semi-weeping habit. Matures slowly. Retains its color best when planted in full sun. A lovely and different accent plant.

	Fir, Balsam	<i>Abies balsamea</i>	Full to Part Sun	Height - 45-55' Spread - 20' Balsam Fir are a slow growing, large, pyramidal evergreen. They are native to Minnesota, and prefer cool, moist soils. They can tolerate some shade. They have short, dark green needles, and hold their shape nicely as they mature.
	Fir, Concolor (White)	<i>Abies concolor</i>	Full Sun	Height - 50' Spread - 30' Blue-green needles and light colored new growth give this plant a cheerful appearance. One of the most desirable pyramidal evergreen trees in the landscape. Prefers moist, well drained soils. 2000 MI Growers' Choice Award Winner. 2003 Great Plants® Award. Rarely to never fed on by Japanese beetles.
	Juniper, Blue Chip	<i>Juniperus horizontalis</i> 'Blue Chip'	Full Sun	Height - 8-10" Spread - 3-5' A prostrate juniper that maintains an outstanding blue color all season. Best in sun or light shade. Compact growth habit that needs little shearing.
	Juniper, Blue Star	<i>Juniperus squamata</i> 'Blue Star'	Full Sun	Height – 2' Spread - 4' Mound form. Bright steel-blue foliage. Slow growing. Great as ground cover or in mass plantings. Prefers cooler climates. Drought tolerant.
	Juniper, Blueberry Delight	<i>Juniperus communis depressa</i> 'AmiDak'	Full Sun	Height - 1' Spread - 4-5' Dense, low-spreading Juniper with rich, dark green needles with a contrasting silvery blue line on the upper leaf surface. A North Dakota State University introduction.
	Juniper, Broadmoor	<i>Juniperus sabina</i> 'Broadmoor'	Full Sun	Height - 12" Spread - 3-5' A hardy, low spreader with a dense mounding form. The foliage has rich green color with a slight blue cast. Best in sun and well drained soil. Resistant to juniper blight.
	Juniper, Calgary Carpet®	<i>Juniperus sabina</i> 'Monna'	Full Sun	Height - 8-12" Spread - 10' Superior groundcover with very low, spreading habit. Attractive soft green evergreen foliage. Use in perennial borders or along walkways. Very durable landscape specimen. Tolerates heat, cold, drought.

	Juniper, Compact Andorra	Juniperus horizontalis 'Compacta'	Full Sun	Height - 18" Spread - 3-5' A compact form of the Andorra juniper with light green foliage in summer, that turns a plum color in fall and winter. Excellent, low growing evergreen.
	Juniper, Dwarf Jaggarden	Juniperus procumbens 'Nana'	Full Sun	Height - 6-10" Spread - 3-5' A dwarf evergreen with a mounding, creeping growth habit and beautiful blue-green foliage. A nice accent when planted in a rock garden.
	Juniper, First Editions® Sky High™	Juniperus scopulorum 'Bailigh'	Full Sun	Height - 12-15' Spread - 3-5' Attractive silvery-blue, dense foliage highlights this improved variety of Rocky Mountain juniper. Strongly columnar in form, it requires little pruning to maintain its narrow shape. Selected by Bailey Nurseries from the prairies of North Dakota. Tolerant of dry soil conditions.
	Juniper, Hughes	Juniperus horizontalis 'Hughes'	Full Sun	Height - 15" Spread - 6-8' This silvery-blue, low growing, spreading juniper is very popular. Compact in height and adds color to the landscape.
	Juniper, Medora	Juniperus scopulorum 'Medora'	Full Sun	Height - 10-12' Spread - 3' A selection from the Badlands of North Dakota. A slender-shaped variety with a blue-green color. Needs little shearing to produce a narrow specimen. Slow growing. An excellent columnar blue juniper, hardy and acclimated for the northern prairie states of the U.S. and the prairie provinces of Canada.
	Juniper, Old Gold	Juniperus chinensis 'Old Gold'	Full Sun	Height - 2-3' Spread - 4-5' Widely considered the best golden spreading evergreen. Compact, mounded form. New growth is bright golden-yellow. Great for colorful winter interest. Slow growing.
	Juniper, Prince of Whales	Juniperus horizontalis 'Prince of Wales'	Full Sun	Height - 6" Spread - 3-5' Low-growing, forming a dense mat 4-6 inches high. Medium, bright green color. During late fall and winter the exposed leaves are purple tinged. Very hardy.

	Juniper, Scandia	Juniperus sabina 'Scandia'	Full Sun	Height - 2-3' Spread - 5' Gracefully spreading groundcover with a dense form useful for borders or rock gardens. Very durable and useful in the landscape. Holds its color well through winter.
	Juniper, Sea Green (Mint Julep)	Juniperus chinensis 'Sea Green'	Full Sun	Height - 4-6' Spread - 4-6' Attractive mint-green foliage on graceful, fountain-like arching branches makes this an excellent evergreen for the foundation landscape. The foliage darkens in cold weather.
	Juniper, Wilton Blue Rug	Juniperus horizontalis 'Wiltoni'	Full Sun	Height - 4-6" Spread - 3-5' One of the best prostrate junipers. Forms a dense mat of blue foliage. Excellent as a groundcover or bank planting. Quite attractive when allowed to drape over retaining walls. Full sun to light shade.
	Larch, American (Tamarack)	Larix laricina	Full Sun	Height - 40-80' Spread - 15-30' Also known as tamarack, this open, pyramidal tree has horizontal to drooping branches. The needles are pale green, turning yellow in the autumn before falling. Intolerant of shade and pollution. Grows best in moist, well-drained, acidic soils. Excellent planted in groves in moist soil.
	Pine (white), Blue Shag	Pinus strobus 'Blue Shag'	Full Sun	Height - 3-4' Spread - 4-5' Attractive, slow-growing Eastern white pine. In early years, it forms a low mound of blue-gray. It will eventually put out more vigorous shoots but generally remains wider than it is tall.
	Pine, Eastern White	Pinus strobus	Full to Part Sun	Height - 50-80' Spread - 20-40' Fast growing pine, native to a good part of the Eastern United States. Open to loosely pyramidal as a young tree and becoming gnarled and more irregular with age. Does not do well in open sites in zone 3. Full sun to partial shade.
	Pine, Mugho	Pinus mugo pumilio	Full Sun	Height - 3-5' Spread - 3-6' Dwarf, bright green color in all seasons. Attractive mounded shape that can be maintained by pruning. Especially nice in early summer when new candles of growth appear. Very hardy and rugged.

	Pine, Red (Norway)	<i>Pinus resinosa</i>	Full Sun	Height - 75' Spread - 30' Red Pine is the state tree of Minnesota. The broad, pyramidal growth habit and dense canopy of the Red Pine make it an excellent choice for a natural screen or windbreak. Moderate growth rate. Very insect and disease resistant and very cold hardy.
	Russian Cypress	<i>Microbiota decussata</i>	Full Sun to Full Shade	Height - 12" Spread - 3-4' A dwarf, densely branched evergreen with low-spreading form and foliage that resembles arborvitae. Bright green summer color turning bronze in winter. Grows in both full sun and full shade. Hardy to -40° F. Found in the wild near Vladivostok, E. Siberia. 1998 Cary Award Winner.
	Spruce, Bird's Nest	<i>Picea abies</i> 'Nidiformis'	Full Sun	Height - 3' Spread - 3-4' A beautiful dwarf spruce, broad, dense and slow growing. Light green foliage on spreading branches rises up slightly with nodding tips. A distinctive plant for rock gardens or specimen use. Hardy, rarely to never fed on by Japanese beetles.
	Spruce, Black Hills	<i>Picea glauca densata</i>	Full Sun	Height - 35-45' Spread - 25-30' Shapely "Christmas tree" type evergreen, with short, blue-green needles. Shears easily. Useful as a specimen, hedge, or windbreak. Best in full sun, but tolerates light shade.
	Spruce, Colorado	<i>Picea pungens</i>	Full Sun	Height - 60' Spread - 20' This beautiful spruce varies in color from gray-green to blue-green. A broad, pyramid-shaped evergreen. The dense foliage needs little shearing. Excellent as a specimen, hedge or windbreak. Likes fully exposed, well drained locations.
	Spruce, Dwarf Norway	<i>Picea abies</i> 'Pumila'	Full to Part Sun	Height - 3-4' Spread - 3-4' A dwarf, dense selection that forms a broad globe of 3-4' in height and width. Attractive light green foliage, very hardy. Prefers a colder climate and full sun, but will tolerate light shade. Rarely to never fed on by Japanese beetles.
	Spruce, Fat Albert	<i>Picea pungens</i> 'Fat Albert'	Full Sun	Height - 15' Spread - 8-10' A truly blue spruce, this grafted variety is slow-growing and ideal for situations where you would like a spruce that doesn't ultimately reach 60' in height! 'Fat Albert' has a naturally straight leader and well-shaped form, even as a young tree and requires no staking or training. 2006 Plants of Merit®.

	<p>Spruce, Globe Blue</p>	<p><i>Picea pungens</i> 'Glauca Globosa'</p>	<p>Full Sun</p>	<p>Height - 3-5' Spread - 5-6' Compact, rounded to mound shaped with beautiful blue foliage. Valuable as an accent or specimen plant. Very slow growth.</p>
	<p>Spruce, Norway</p>	<p><i>Picea abies</i></p>	<p>Full Sun</p>	<p>Height - 40-80' Spread - 25-30' A stately tree with a pyramidal shape when young, and pendulous branches as it matures. The largest and fastest growing of the spruces. Large cones are attractive as Christmas ornaments. Rarely to never fed on by Japanese beetles.</p>
	<p>Yew, Dark Green Spreading</p>	<p><i>Taxus x media</i> 'Dark Green'</p>	<p>Shade</p>	<p>Height - 3-5' Spread - 6-8' Attractive dark green foliage. Needs good drainage. Used as a hedge or specimen plant.</p>
	<p>Yew, Upright</p>	<p><i>Taxus cuspidata</i> 'Capitata'</p>	<p>Part Sun to Shade</p>	<p>Height - 25-40' Spread - 25-35' The only tree form of Japanese yew. Dense slow grower with rich, dark green foliage. Tolerates shearing and can be grown in full sun or heavy shade. Requires good drainage. Can be used as a trimmed 8-10 foot hedge. Rarely to never fed on by Japanese beetles.</p>
